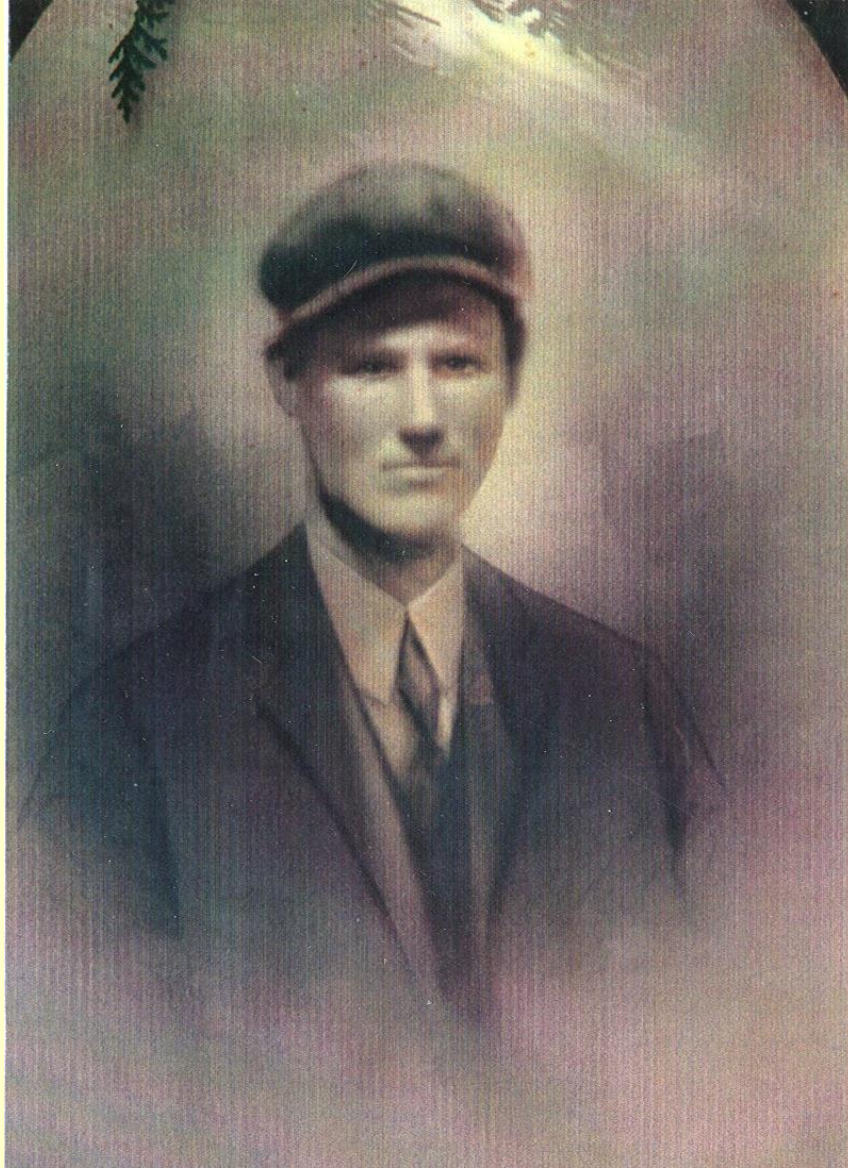

DECK HAND OF PILGRIM DIES

Freeman W. Wallace of Lancaster St. Falls From Steamer

Freeman W. Wallace, 29, of 97 Lancaster street, a deck hand on the steamer Pilgrim of the Casco Bay line was drowned yesterday afternoon at Forest City Landing, Peaks Island, when he was thrown into the water as the rail of the upper starboard gangway gave way. Twenty minutes later his body was recovered by Officer Fred Greely and Joe Trott with the aid of a grappling iron.

Dr. R. P. Black who was summoned while the men were searching for the body made desperate efforts to revive the victim but was unsuccessful. There was a cut over the left eye and contusions on the side of the face and body, where it was believed the victim was struck by the pier and rendered unconscious as his body plunged toward the water. Dr. R. F. Goodhue, medical examiner, performed an autopsy and reported that death was due to drowning.

Wallace was a resident of Jonesport but had been working in this City for the past few Winters. This season he decided to work for the Casco Bay line. He is survived by his wife and a family of 10 children, five of these being by a former marriage of his wife.
